NOTICE TO THE PUBLIC

As agenda items are discussed by the Board during the Open Session of the Board Meeting, audience participation is permitted. The President will recognize those members of the audience who wish to speak.

The President will set a time limit on each person's remarks if he/she feels it necessary. Individual speakers shall be allowed three (3) minutes to address the Board on each agenda or non-agenda item. With Board consent, the president may increase or decrease the time allowed for individual comments. The Board shall limit the total time for public input on each item to twenty (20) minutes. With Board consent, the president may increase or decrease the time allowed for public presentation, depending on the topic and the number of persons wishing to be heard. The president may take a poll of speakers for or against a particular issue and may ask that additional persons speak only if they have something new to add. Generally, the President will ask Board Members for the remarks prior to recognizing requests to speak from the audience. At the President's discretion, agenda items may be considered in an order other than numerical order.

Closed Sessions may convene before, after or during the Regular Meeting. Closed Session items may include personnel, litigation, negotiations and/or students discipline.

(BACKGROUND: California School Boards Association provides districts with a recommended board policy manual and publishes legal updates for board policies. The attached Board Policies, Administrative Regulations and Exhibits need to be approved to bring the district's Policy manual up to date.)

B. <u>Conduct Review of New Exhibit 4040-E(2)</u>, <u>Employee Use of Technology: Social Media and Technology Use</u> (Justin Kern)

(BACKGROUND: California School Boards Association provides districts with a recommended board policy manual and publishes legal updates for board policies. The attached is a new Exhibit being added and is being brought to the Governing Board for review to clarify how the District implements social media and technology use under BP 4040.)

(BACKGROUND: AB 130 included changes to the age at which families have the option of starting students in Transitional Kindergarten (TK). This policy change brings GUSD into compliance with the legal mandates of the assembly bill. By 2025-26, all students just turning 4 at the start of the school year can be enrolled in TK.)

B. Approve Board Resolution 16-2122, Classified Seniority List (Julie Vang)

(BACKGROUND: The Gridley Unified School District's Superintendent may be recommending the reduction of particular kinds of services to meet the needs of the district. This reduction of hours and/or positions may result in classified staff layoffs. California Education Code Section 45308 provides that in the event of a classified employee layoff, employees must be terminated in reverse order of seniority.)

C. Approve Board Resolution 17-2122, Certificated Seniority List (Julie Vang)

(BACKGROUND: The district superintendent may be recommending particular kinds of services reductions due to declining enrollment. This reduction of positions may result in staff layoffs. California Education Code Section 44955(b) provides that in the event of certificated layoffs, employees must be terminated in reverse order of seniority.)

D. Approve Board Resolution 18-2122, Tie Breaking Criteria for 2021-22 School Year (Julie Vang)

(BACKGROUND: The Board is required to adopt tie-breaking criteria for individuals with the same seniority date.)

E. <u>Approve Expenditure to Submit Plans to Department of State Architect (DSA) for Gridley High School Classroom Replacement</u> (Heather Naylor)

(BACKGROUND:: The architects from Nichols, Melburg & Rossetto have been working on the plans for the new classrooms at Gridley High School. A representative from the architect firm will be at the board meeting to answer any questions. In order to submit the plans to DSA, payment for plan review must accompany the plans. The district needs to pay fees which total \$53,940.00)
