NOTICE TO THE PUBLIC

As agenda items are discussed by the Board during the Open Session of the Board Meeting, audience participation is permitted. The President will recognize those members of the audience who wish to speak.

The President will set a time limit on each person's remarks if he/she feels it necessary. Individual speakers shall be allowed three (3) minutes to address the Board on each agenda or non-agenda item. With Board consent, the president may increase or decrease the time allowed for individual comments. The Board shall limit the total time for public input on each item to twenty (20) minutes. With Board consent, the president may increase or decrease the time allowed for public presentation, depending on the topic and the number of persons wishing to be heard. The president may take a poll of speakers for or against a particular issue and may ask that additional persons speak only if they have something new to add. Generally, the President will ask Board Members for the remarks prior to recognizing requests to speak from the audience. At the President's discretion, agenda items may be considered in an order other than numerical order.

Closed Sessions may convene before, after or during the Meeting. Closed Session items may include personnel, litigation, and negotiations and/or student's discipline.

A. <u>Conduct Third Reading and Approve of Board Policies, Administrative Regulations and Exhibits updated March 2023</u> (Justin Kern)

(BACKGROUND: California School Boards Association provides districts with a recommended board policy manual and publishes legal updates for board policies. The attached Board Policies, Administrative Regulations and Exhibits needs to be approved to bring the district's policy manual up to date.)

B. <u>Approve Gridley Unified School District 2024-25 Instructional Calendar with Regular and Minimum Day Dismissal Times</u> (Julie Vang)

(BACKGROUND: The Board previously approved the instructional days for the 2024-25 school year at the February 21, 2024 Board meeting. The district staff has developed the explanation for semester breaks and minimum days in the format that is familiar to staff and the community.)

C. Approve Student Chromebook Refresh for 2024-25 (Michael Pilakowski)

(BACKGROUND: GUSD students are issued a new Chromebook at entrance to Grade 6, as are incoming freshmen new to the district in grade 9, that is expected to carry them through to Grade 12. Further, periodic refresh of the classroom units in elementary grades is needed as units wear out or no longer accept software updates.)

D. Approve Purchase of Replacement Teacher Laptops (Michael Pilakowski)

(BACKGROUND: Staff recommend purchase approval for approximately 60% of the fleet of certificated staff laptops to be replaced. Current laptops represent purchase made at the start of the COVID pandemic in August 2020 from what was in stock with vendors when we were forced to pivot for continued 100% distance learning.)

E. <u>Approve Board Resolution #15-2324 - Implementation of Proposed Classified Eliminations/Reductions</u> (Julie Vang)

(BACKGROUND: On March 6, 2024, the Governing Board approved Board Resolution 11-2324 Reduction of Classified Staff. Pursuant to Board Resolution 11-2324, Human Resources sent notices to thirty-one (31) affected classified employees on or before March 15, 2024 informing the employees regarding being subject to layoff for the 2024-25 school year. No hearing requests were made from affected employees. Employees will be notified with final layoff notices indicated in this resolution after its approval.)

F. Approve the Sunshine Proposals of the GUSD and the California Employees Association and its South Butte Chapter 395 (Julie Vang)

(BACKGROUND: In the continuing effort to maintain and improve the collective bargaining agreement between GUSD and CSEA, the parties will reopen the GUSD/CSEA collective bargaining agreement for 2024-25 SY. The GUSD and CSEA agree to open all the articles identified in each sunshine proposal submitted.)

G. Approve Certificated job description for an MTSS Intervention Teacher-on-Special Assignment position (Julie Vang)

(BACKGROUND: After careful evaluation and discussion, district administration has determined that the creation of a new position based on grant-funding would be necessary. A job description is needed for this new position in the district.)
